Allow students to attend school closer to home	Students in the communities of Capitol Hill, Evanston, Hamptons, Hillhurst, Montgomery, Rocky Ridge/Royal Oak, Sage Hill, Sherwood, Silver Springs, Tuscany and Varsity will attend school closer to home.
Concerns about maintaining quality of French Immersion programming in a new school location	New Early French Immersion programming consolidated in two new school locations allows for quality programming for students. Grandfathering enables new Early French Immersion Programs to build over time.
Current Early French Immersion student cohorts should be maintained	A grandfathering period for some grades in some communities has been built into the proposed plan to provide the opportunity for students to move schools only once in the next two years, just as they would if there were no change.
Keep the regular program in communities where it exists now	Regular programs have been maintained at all existing school locations considered in this engagement process.
Allow opportunity for growth of both Early and Late French Immersion programs	New Early French Immersion programming at two new school locations, boundary changes and adjustments to grade configuration increase the space available for the Early and Late French Immersion Programs to grow.
Do not limit access to French Immersion programming	The proposed plan provides opportunities for increased access and growth of the Early and Late French Immersion Programs in northwest and north central Calgary.
