CBE invites Calgarians to view preliminary plans for new schools

CALGARY— The Calgary Board of Education (CBE) is currently involved in 16 capital projects including new school builds, major modernizations and the construction of replacement schools.

The CBE will be holding an open house on June 18 to give parents and community stakeholders the opportunity to learn more about these projects, view preliminary siting and project development information and ask questions about the facilities.

“We are undertaking an unprecedented number of major school capital projects, ranging from modernizations to new schools” says Frank Coppinger, superintendent of facilities and environmental services.

“This is an opportunity for all Calgarians to drop-in, see the early plans for these schools and speak to planners, designers and CBE employees.”
