TRANSFORMING PERSPECTIVES, SHAPING COMMUNITIES



What does a healthy community look like? What does it mean for me to be an engaged citizen? What is the difference between charity and justice? What's our story? What is resilience? These are a few of the questions that can be explored at SEEDschool.

The Mustard Seed has long been engaged in intentional student learning experiences. SEEDschool evolved out of 22 years of summer

initiating a pilot program together; from this, The Mustard Seed's pilot project for the 2017/2018 academic year was born. Beginning with five weeks of programming and growing, SEEDschool is now an official site for the 2018/2019 school year.

At SEEDschool, teachers and students are immersed in workshops, experiential learning, and service-learning. These experiences develop





learning programs, and two decades of speaking and teaching in school classrooms. During the 2015/2016 school year, The Mustard Seed advanced their relationship with local schools to bring students on-site for tours and workshops, and consequently developed relationship with three Campus Calgary programs. As the Campus

Calgary sites began integrating The Mustard Seed into their weekly schedules, The Mustard Seed and CC/OM began to dream about

and build capacity for critical understandings of our interconnected Calgary-community. Each week of SEEDschool is uniquely designed around the inquiry question, student & teacher interest in activities, and opportunities to build connections to the work of The Mustard Seed and surrounding community.
