




Planning Principles

- Provide equitable access for all students to quality learning environments and choice of programs












2019-20 Residential Districts and Designated Schools



Proposed Plan for Early French Immersion Program



Proposed Plan for Late French Immersion Program








Early French Immersion Middle Schools









Note | Communities not included in this graphic are in the walk zone.


* The mode of transportation is subject to change. A strategy of the long-term sustainable transportation model is to move more middle school and junior high school students onto Calgary Transit.




Proposed Plan Transportation Implications
