Important Changes to the Student Population at Buffalo Rubbing Stone School

Dear Parents/Guardians,

In the fall, the Calgary Board of Education (CBE) identified a need to explore options to balance K-9 enrolment in the three schools in the community of Panorama Hills while ensuring regular program students could continue to attend school in the community. The CBE gathered feedback at an in-person session and through an online survey to understand what was important to affected families as we considered changes to school boundaries and grade configurations for schools in the community.

After careful review and consideration of the feedback, we have decided to make the following changes to the student population at Buffalo Rubbing Stone School effective September 2019:

- K-5 regular program grade reconfiguration
- School boundary changed between Panorama Hills and Buffalo Rubbing Stone schools (see <u>map</u>)

This means that for the 2019-20 school year, the student population at Buffalo Rubbing Stone will include:

- K-5 regular program
- TASC class for students with complex learning needs

This decision allows K-9 regular program students to remain at schools in the Panorama Hills community and keeps all K-5 students within the walk zone for their designated elementary school.

We believe this is a sustainable plan that provides strong learning opportunities for students. It also balances our values and planning principles with what we heard from affected families.

Thank you to everyone who participated in the in-person session and online survey. Your thoughtful contributions have made a meaningful difference in decision-making.

Top themes from the online survey were: satisfaction that CBE listened to initial feedback and made modifications to implementation where possible; appreciation that siblings can remain together in the modified plan; appreciation that families previously asked to move from Panorama Hills School are able to remain at Buffalo Rubbing Stone School; concerns about Buffalo Rubbing Stone School being over capacity for the next few years; concerns about the differences in school organization and culture between Buffalo Rubbing Stone and Panorama Hills schools; concerns about school start and end times The complete online survey report is available on our <u>website</u>.

How will changes be phased in?

Students living in the new boundary for Panorama Hills School (see map):

- Current K-2 students who do not have a sibling currently in Grade 3 or Grade 4 at Buffalo Rubbing School will move to Panorama Hills School for the 2019-20 school year.
- Current Grade 3 and Grade 4 students are able to continue to attend Buffalo Rubbing Stone School until they complete Grade 5.
- All new students who do not have a sibling who continues to be designated to Buffalo Rubbing Stone School are designated to Panorama Hills School effective September 2019.

All students currently in Grade 4 at Buffalo Rubbing Stone will remain for Grade 5 in the 2019-20 school year.

Will students need to register at the new school location?

There is no need to register. Students who are re-designated will automatically be designated to their new school.

How will students get to school?

All K-5 regular program students are within walking distance to their elementary school therefore no transportation services will be provided for regular program students to either Buffalo Rubbing Stone School or Panorama Hills School.

What support will families and students receive during the transition?

Each school may provide support in different ways, such as hosting an information session, offering a school tour or other means of communication. Your school will provide information regarding these opportunities once they are determined.

When a student with complex learning needs moves from one school to another, the supports required to fulfill the IPP requirements move with them. Teachers and staff at the former and new school will collaborate to ensure the student's needs are met.

What about bell times, school calendars, transfer of resources and fundraising dollars, and other decisions?

School administration will communicate any potential changes with parents, students and staff throughout the implementation process. Any changes will balance the best interest for the school community and CBE. The CBE Administrative Regulations and other requirements and efficiencies will also be considered in these decisions. Check your school website and newsletter regularly for updates.
