What Will Guide Decision-Making

- CBE values
- CBE planning principles
- Stakeholder input and feedback
- Other factors such as government legislation

CBE Values

- Students come first.
- Learning is our central purpose.
- Public education serves the common good.

CBE Planning Principles

- Minimize disruptions for students
- Provide program continuity from kindergarten to Grade 12
- Keep cohort groups of students together
- Allow students to attend school as close to home as possible
- Provide long term sustainability
- Use space and resources effectively
- Provide equitable access for all students to quality learning environments and choice of programs

Feedback and Scenario Development

- 86 per cent of respondents agreed with the possibility of K-4 Cougar Ridge students attending school closer to home
- Opportunities:
 - Allows students to attend school as close to home as possible
 - Less transportation overall
- Challenges:
 - Lottery process
 - Overcrowding

Proposed Scenario

Students from Cougar Ridge designated to West Springs School for kindergarten to Grade 4

- West Springs School
 - Current students will remain at the school
 - Priority registration for West Springs community and current Cougar Ridge students at Rosscarrock and Wildwood schools
 - Enrolment capped to preserve grade configuration and learning spaces
 - If needed, lottery will apply to Cougar Ridge students not currently attending Rosscarrock or Wildwood school

Proposed Scenario

Students from Cougar Ridge designated to West Springs School for Kindergarten to Grade 4

- Wildwood School designated overflow school
- Busing provided to Grade 3 students from Cougar Ridge who wish to remain at Rosscarrock School for Grade 4
- Busing from Cougar Ridge to Wildwood ends June 30, 2018 unless overflow needed

Proposed Scenario Projections

School	Capacity	Projected Enrolment (5-Year)
Rosscarrock School	450	125-150
West Ridge School	900	700-725*
West Springs School	600	550-575*
Wildwood School	550	330-355

^{*}Assumes number of new students from Cougar Ridge enrolling at West Springs School to be capped at approximately 50 in 2018, with room for 200 in 2022.
