**CALGARY** — Students in the Performing and Visual Arts Program at Central Memorial High School are working together with the United Way on a contemporary rendition of the musical Oliver! Based on the novel *Oliver Twist* by Charles Dickens from1835, the musical addresses societal treatment of the disadvantaged. The updated version tells the story of Oliver, an abused and homeless youth, and the Tent City community that he meets up with in East Hastings, Vancouver.
