CBE celebrates official school openings and launch of career and technology centre

The Calgary Board of Education is pleased to officially open four middle schools and the launch of its Career and Technology Centre at Lord Shaughnessy High School.

The middle schools, which welcomed students last fall, are Captain Nichola Goddard School, Nose Creek School, Ted Harrison School and Twelve Mile Coulee School. The schools:

- offer the regular program
- opened for Grades 4-8 (and in one case for Grades 5 -8). All will expand to accommodate Grade 9 students in September 2013
- were built as part of the Government of Alberta's second Alberta Schools Alternative Procurement project which uses a P3 (public-private partnership) delivery process to construct new schools
- are designed to achieve a minimum of a Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Silver certified rating
