## CBE Board of Trustees survey public as part of search for new Chief Superintendent

**CALGARY** — The Board of Trustees of the Calgary Board of Education has begun the search for a new Chief Superintendent of Schools, following the resignation of current Chief Superintendent Naomi Johnson.

Survey respondents will be asked about priorities and expectations for the knowledge, experience and leadership qualities of the CBE's next Chief Superintendent of Schools. The responses will help inform the Board of Trustees as they create a profile description to use in their search.

"Recruiting a new Chief Superintendent is one of the key priorities of the Board of Trustees this year," said Sheila Taylor, Chair, Board of Trustees. "We all have a part to play in public education, and we are very interested to hear what our community feels is important in a new leader for our system."
