Molly Burke's world began to darken at the age of four when she was diagnosed with retinitis pigmentosa, a retinal disease causing vision loss. Burke brings audiences a uniquely young and current perspective on issues many students face each day. Her powerful message is that any challenge in life, whether it's bullying, mental illness or loss of vision, can be overcome.

We also welcome inspirational presentations from five other guest speakers, Alvin Law, Paul Davies, Dwayne Peace, Connie Jacobs, and Lori Pulliam.
