Multi Cluster Courses

Innovation Technology Courses

Innovation Technology courses focus on a variety of STEM concepts. These classes expose students to a broad range of knowledge and technical skills using modern and emerging technologies such as 3D-printers, laser cutters, microcontrollers, electronics, robotics, and more.

The course name, specific skills and concepts, credit structure, equipment and technology utilized in innovation technology courses may vary from school to school.

Common names for Innovation technology courses include Design Innovation, Robotics, Engineering Studies, etc.

Check individual high school websites to determine the Innovation Technology courses offered at each location.

CTS & KE pathway and program offerings may change over time due to staffing, enrollment, equipment and/or facilities
